No Longer Empty is excited to announce InJustUs and (after)care, two art exhibitions taking place on campus at NYC Health + Hospitals/Kings County. Curated by Young Exhibi-

tion Makers (Y.Ex) and the NLE Curatorial Lab, respectively, both shows will be unveiled on

Saturday, June 1, in CG-95 and throughout the D-Lobby of Kings County. The shows are free and will be open to the public until June 23. InJustUs will be open daily during regular D-Lobby hours and (after)care will be on view Wednesdays through Sundays, 12pm - 7pm in room CG-95.

InJustUs explores community wellness by sharing different viewpoints of various social injustices in the hopes of educating visitors. The exhibition features teen artists from across New York City whose work touch on issues relevant to police brutality, mental health, gender & sexuality, race and ethnicity, and immigration. Through the discussion of these themes, Y.Ex hopes that InJustUs serves as a mirror to the community's concerns.

(after)care re-envisions a former emergency waiting room as an art exhibition and creative community space of remembrance, possibility, and celebration beyond the hospital walls. Acknowledging that care for oneself and for others can be a radical act, (after)care brings together artists and practitioners whose work amplifies a fabric of care that is everyday collaborative, and generative — one that strives toward a sense of collective survival and joy.

Free, public events throughout the month will focus on themes of mental health and accessibility, professional development for Flatbush artists, art-making workshops for families, exhi-

bition tours, and more!
